Talk It Over

- 5. Read Acts 4 (especially vs. 8–13 & 18–20). In a very short time, the disciples went from doubt and fearfulness to courage and boldness. What are possible explanations for their dramatic change of outlook?
- 6. How would you define hope? How do Jesus' resurrection and the promises of 1 Corinthians 15:54b–57 & 2 Corinthians 5:17 bring real hope?
- 7. If the resurrection of Jesus actually happened, in what ways could/should that reality affect our daily lives?
