Talk It Over

- 1. What's one idea from the message that really stood out to you? Why did this idea grab your attention?

- 5. 2 Chronicles 34:14–33 describes a time in the life of the nation of Judah—which had been founded (as a part of the nation of Israel) on the basis of accountability and gratefulness to God—where they had pushed God to the margins of their society. What similarities or differences do you see with America today?
- 6. In the passage from 2 Chronicles above, what was Josiah's response? What was the result of this response? Do you think a similar response have a similar outcome today? Why or why not?
- 7. In light of our country's past experience & present circumstances and your hopes and dreams for the future of it, what is the wise thing for Christians to do?
