Discussion Questions

Name It

1. What is one thing that stuck out to you from the sermon?
2. Have you ever discovered through social media that someone you like holds views very different from yours? How did that affect your relationship? (Please avoid getting into divisive conversations about politics, culture, or religion here.)

Know It

1. Do you have anything in the sermon that felt unclear to you?
2. Read 1 Corinthians 1:10-12. The sermon said, *"Pride enlarges personalities while making Christ smaller."* Where do you see that temptation in church culture or even in yourself?
3. Read 1 Corinthians 6:19-20. Paul ties moral compromise to a deeper identity issue: *"You are not your own."* How does remembering who you belong to change the way you think about personal freedom?

Think It

1. When conflict arises in a group (family, workplace, church), what do you instinctively focus on: being right, keeping peace, or protecting the relationship?
2. Consider 1 Corinthians 5-7 and the sermon section on being *"Divided by Immorality."* The Corinthians were either tolerating sin or over-correcting toward legalism. Why do we tend to swing between extremes? How can we fix that in our own lives and in the Church (universal)?
3. Consider 1 Corinthians 15. How does the hope of resurrection steady relationships in times of tension or grief? How does a secure future shape how we treat one another now?

Change It

1. The closing question was: *"Are we close or are we centered?"* What would it look like this week for you to actively re-center your life on the cross?
