1. Read Colossians 1:12–14. Which of the phrases that Paul uses to explain what God has already done for believers stands out to you the most?
2. Read Colossians 2:4, 8. Paul warns about "fine-sounding arguments" and "hollow philosophy." What kinds of messages today subtly communicate that Jesus is not enough?

Think It

1. Paul says in Colossians 3 that the supremacy of Christ breaks down human divisions. Where do you see divisions in our culture or community that the gospel speaks into?
2. Think about Colossians 2:13–14 and 3:13. Why is remembering Christ's forgiveness essential for forgiving others?
3. In Colossians 3:12–15, Paul says believers should clothe themselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Which of these virtues is the hardest for you to practice consistently? Why?

1. Who is someone you need to forgive like Christ forgave you?
2. In Colossians 4:5–6, Paul says our conversations should be "full of grace, seasoned with salt." What might our conversations look like in real situations this week (workplace, family, social media, neighbors) if we lived this out?
